7 TIPS TO REDUCE YOUR RISK OF DEVELOPING SKIN CANCER

- 1 SEEK SHADE** especially between 10am and 4pm.
- 2 COVER UP** with clothing, including a broad-brimmed hat and UV-blocking sunglasses.
- 3 APPLY SUNSCREEN**
EVERY DAY Use a broad spectrum SPF 15+ sunscreen. FOR EXTENDED OUTDOOR EXPOSURE use SPF 30+. REAPPLY every 2 hours and after swimming, excessive sweating or toweling off.
- 4 AVOID SUN TANNING**
- 5 NEVER USE TANNING BEDS**
- 6 KEEP NEWBORNS OUT OF THE SUN**
sunscreen should only be used on babies over 6 months.
